


## LEADERSHIP BEGINS IN SEPTEMBER

#### **Princeton VFW Post 806**

The VFW traces its roots back to 1899 when veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service: Many arrived home wounded or sick. There was no medical care or veterans' pension for them, and they were left to care for themselves. Some of these veterans banded together and formed organizations with what would become known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. After chapters were formed in Ohio, Colorado and Pennsylvania, the movement quickly gained momentum. By 1915, membership grew to 5,000; by 1936, membership was almost 200,000. We are proud to have the Princeton VFW as a part of our chamber.

#### **Prairie Restorations**

Prairie Restorations, Inc. was founded in 1977 by Ron Bowen as one of the first companies in the nation devoted exclusively to designing, restoring and managing native prairie plant communities. Since then, they've grown from three employees in a single location to a full-time staff of over 85 employees in six locations throughout Minnesota.
