PACCT HISTORY

The Princeton Area Chamber of Commerce (PACCT) is a membership association of approximately 150 businesses and growing.

The mission of the PACCT is to lead, promote and advocate for our community partners to make Princeton a great destination city.

Chamber members enjoy a number of opportunities each year for connection, education and community involvement. The Princeton Area Chamber of Commerce (PACC) was founded in 1926 and filed Articles of Incorporation with the state of Minnesota on May 28, 1957. It is an organization comprised of businesses, civic groups and individuals from every segment of the community. The purpose of the Chamber is to unite local commerce, civic organizations and citizens for the benefit of all with the common goal to strengthen and promote the community as a whole.

In 2023, the organization added the tourism arm to the chamber and became the Princeton Area Chamber of Commerce & Tourism (PACCT).

The Chamber is financed through membership investments and creative fund-raising efforts. The PACC is not a tax-funded government organization, but rather, a non-profit organization.

WELCOMING COMMITTEE

The chamber hosts a candidate forum typically every four years. This committee helps plan the forum, including posting questions, getting it online and finding a moderator and volunteers.


VFW CORNHOLE TOURNAMENT

TIGER COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

Businesses Supporting Schools - Schools Supporting Businesses

Tiger Community Connections is a business-education partnership in Princeton dedicated to building strong bonds between our local schools and business communities.

PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Habits of a Tiger: Hang the 5 Habits of a Tiger poster up at your business to show you support these skills (Critical Thinkers, Positive Leaders, Effective Communicators, Self-Aware, Empathetic Citizens)

Job Postings: Advertise your open jobs for students ages 14-18 on the PHS Job Opportunities board.

Workforce Panel: Take part in a workforce panel for Princeton High School and/or Middle School students and talk about your industry and business as students explore career opportunities.

Mock Interviews: Interview high school juniors during PHS Mock Interview Week to provide students with interview practice. You can choose the number of hours you participate.

Just Desserts: Take part in this Chamber event where you'll meet high school students to give them practice talking with a business professional.

Industry Specialists: Spend time with students and/or teachers either on site at your business or at the school teaching about your industry and providing tours.

Career Shadow Week: Sign up to host students at your business during Career Shadow Week.

Informational Video: Submit a video of your businesses career opportunities and industry information to be shared with students through existing PHS programming and curriculum.

Become a Business Mentor: The school will connect you with a student who you will mentor and make connections with as the student explores different career options.

Tiger Community Connections: Join the Tiger Community Connections Advisory Group to provide input and help plan these activities in collaboration with the school district.

Become a Internship Host: Provide a paid, on-the-job work experience for students who have completed career academy courses for your industry.

CTE Advisory Committee: Meet with local CTE educators to ensure classes are aligned to local industry needs to better equip students with the skills needed to succeed.
